Course Title: Social Studies 6th grade- Early World History

Course Textbook: *World History Great Civilizations: Ancient through Modern Times* (National Geographic/Cengage Learning, 2016)

Course Description: This is a mandatory course designed for students to explore and study the ancient civilizations of the Near East and Far East, Greek and Roman civilizations, and continues through Medieval European life. Typically, the rise and fall of civilizations and empires are studies highlighting the legacies provided to successive societies. Sixth grade Social Studies Benchmark, Content and Performance Standards (History, Geography, Civics and Government, and Economics) will be included in this course.

Course Objective: Students will complete historical readings, projects and assignments designed to improve skills in comprehension, listening, reading, writing, speaking, researching, creativity and critical thinking.

Course Goal: The goal of this class is to advance the student’s understanding of our world’s early history and how it relates to our present society, please see quote at the top of the page. We will also be taking the 6th Grade End-of-Course (EOC) this year. Our goal is to show great success on this test.

Periods Taught: 4th, 6th and 7th.

Grading Policy: Students will be graded on a point system. Homework/Classwork-50%, Tests/Quizzes-40%, Attendance/Participation 10%.

Grading Scale:

100-90 = A	69-60 = D
89-80 = B	59 – 0 = F
79–70 = C	

Students are required to have parent/guardian signatures on any assignments, tests, or projects that receive a grade of D or F. Students are also to have parent/guardian signatures on grade reports. All papers with parent/guardian signatures are to be returned to Mr. Taylor.

Homework: Assignments not completed in class may be considered homework unless they are due the day they were assigned; homework is due the next day, unless specified otherwise. Additional homework and projects will be assigned. **Project assignments are required to have parent/guardian signatures indicating awareness of the project and the due date.**

Homework is due on the ascribed due date, completed and ready to be turned in at the beginning of class. Any assignment not turned in on time, for any reason, will be given a 0 until made-up.

No extra credit work will be given.

A **project** not turned in on the assigned due **date will lose one full letter grade for each day it is late-** (exceptions MAY apply – contact me ASAP)! **Homework and projects WILL NOT be accepted on a computer disk/CD/DVD!** (They are often not compatible with the school computers). Hard copies or, if absent, send to btaylor@paparts.net This address is for homework only and as a failsafe. If there are computer/printer issues at home students may try alternative areas such as public libraries, for profit businesses, a friend's computer/printer or ...

Absences and make-up work: In accordance with PAPA policy, make-up work will only be accepted for **excused** absences. Students will be allowed one day for each day missed. **It is the students' responsibility to make-up missed work.** There is a class agenda book for students to check to see what was missed. Assignments for **unexcused** absences cannot be made up. All missing work, whether absence related or not, will receive a 0 until turned in to Mr. Taylor.

Class Rules: In accordance with the PAPA Middle School policy, the Class Rules are as follows:

These are simple rules and we will discuss them further in class to make sure everyone is exactly sure what is expected. There are no routine class breaks and students are not allowed to eat food in class unless provided by the teacher or for special occasions with teacher permission. Only water in closable containers are allowed in class.

Class materials; Students are required to have a black or blue pen or a pencil, their class binder (1 ½ - 2 inch three ring binder), and paper with them daily.

Each student is expected to keep their notebook organized, keeping homework is strongly recommended. Each student will have a textbook assigned to them and will need to bring it to class and take it home as necessary.

Additional class items may be needed for projects and will be discussed at a later date. Students will need to provide materials for their individual and group projects.

Backpacks must be placed on the sides of the room in an organized manner, also no large gear bags are allowed in class.

Teaching Styles: I strive to use the three Ds: Directing – promotes learning through listening and following directions, Discussing – promotes learning through interaction, and Delegating-promotes learning through empowerment. I also use Bloom's Taxonomy, <https://lib.guides.umd.edu/c.php?g=598357&p=4142337> and Webb's Depth of Knowledge, <http://inservice.ascd.org/what-exactly-is-depth-of-knowledge-hint-its-not-a-wheel/>, to help guide my questioning and testing.
