New Facility:

The church building plan is off the table. APS decided not to pursue it due to cost.

Daphne Benavides, Rhonda Cordova, and I met with Kizito Wijenje, Patty Matthews, Ruji Rajbhandari, and Mark Tolley to discuss facility plans. In summary:

- Patty Matthews discussed the HB33, SB9 MOU. The MOU currently states that the HB33 and SB9 money submitted to PAPA can be used for any facility need in the APS district. Mark Tolley agreed to take the MOU back and work the language (through Zach McCormac) in the form of an addendum to clarify that the money is used for PAPA facilities. Ms. Matthews will work on this with them.
- APS is looking for alternative locations.
- Memo to Mr. Wijenje (see attached).
- Meeting with Ms. Rajbhandari is set for March 28, 2011, to review immediate facility needs and create a priority list. The \$2.8 million earmarked for PAPA will not be used to take care of immediate needs. HB33 and SB9 will be used.
- Mr. Wijenje was still working on the Master Plan website link.
- Mr. Tolley will set up a meeting with Rose Ann McKernan and the design team.
- The flow of traffic is a concern of the local community. Mr. Wijenje will send the “Blues Team” to work on a plan.

- We held parent conferences in conjunction with in-service. We were able to meet with 73% of the parents scheduled.

State Legislative Session

- Good news – Small School Size Adjustment and Lease Reimbursement remain in tact.
- Bad news – 1.5% cut in budget for next year.
- Charter School Day was a huge success! Our staff and students manned the PAPA booth, and students were Pages for Representative Picraux. Our students also talked with Secretary Skandera and various law-makers. The administration made some valuable networking contacts.
