I had considered inviting other choirs, but came to the conclusion that an inclusive tour is not in the best interest of the program. This is an honor bestowed upon the most advanced choir group. Les Chanteuses was invited. They earned that honor. They are expected to put forth that extra effort in rehearsal and are required to perform at many more events than the other choirs. This is a performance tour for that group. It is a learning situation much different from just a tour as it focuses on the advanced nature of the group. I don't want the tour watered down into a field trip.

Reflective of PAPA's vision, membership in Les Chanteuses requires audition and the maintenance of higher learning standards both artistically and academically. This type of tour should be earned. I believe Les Chanteuses has earned the honor through auditions, competitions, training and performance.

Adding another group to this tour changes the timbre of the tour by adding students who may not have the same level of ability and willingness to put forth the effort as those in Les Chanteuses. Our intention for students is to provide quality on our tours not quantity. High School mixed choir does not have the same requirements as Les Chanteuse and is intended for introducing students to singing.

Our population at PAPA is mostly female and suits the school well to have a main performance group of all treble singers. We have attempted to form an all Men's choir for Bass and tenors but the interest and the population is not there to sustain such a class.

I hope you see the reasoning behind my "rethinking" this proposal and you will agree to let Les Chanteuses work to have this honor.

C.2.1 ADVERTISING OF POSITIONS

All full-time and part-time employee positions at PAPA (including adjunct teaching positions) shall initially be advertised/posted on the PAPA, APS, and PED websites and/or at least one time in the Albuquerque Journal. , The Executive Director may advertise in other publications. If an applicant for a newly created or vacant position has already been employed by PAPA as an independent contractor or part-time employee in a related capacity with similar duties and responsibilities, and the Council or Executive Committee determines that advertising the newly created or vacant position would, because of the associated time delays, jeopardize the ability of PAPA to carry out its mission, the Council or Executive Committee may waive the necessity of advertising.

J.8.9 HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 9.1 PAPA will adhere to NMPED's requirements for high school graduation. PAPA's requirements may be adjusted in response to changes made by NMPED and as needed to uphold PAPA's mission and vision. Current requirements include a combination of high school credits and demonstration of competency in five core subject areas through assessments.
- 9.2 If a student earns the course credit but does not demonstrate competence on any or all of the five assessment areas, the student may utilize an Alternative Demonstration of Competency (ADC). The student will meet with administration and/or the academic dean for formalize a plan to satisfy the requirements and earn a NM Diploma of Excellence. If the student does not meet criteria listed below, she or he will be awarded a certificate indicating course credits earned and grade level completed.
