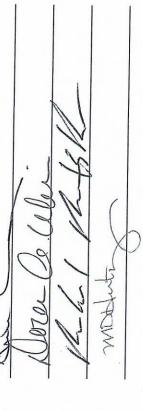

The Governor signed Senate Bill 119, Increase Minimum Teacher Salaries, Laws of 2018, Chapter 72, on March 7, 2018. The provisions of that legislation created new minimum salary requirements for each teacher licensure level: \$36,000 for level one, \$44,000 for level two and \$54,000 for level three. As such, teachers in the applicable licensure levels earning below these amounts must advance to the new minimum salary requirements. The Governor also signed House Bill 2, The General Appropriation Act of 2018, Laws of 2018, Chapter 73, on March 7, 2018, and the provisions of the General Appropriation Act of 2018 (GAA) also state that the Secretary of Education shall review budget proposals so that no full-time level one teacher shall earn a base salary of less than \$36,000; no full-time level two teacher shall earn a base salary of less than \$44,000 and no full-time level three-A teacher shall earn a base salary of less than \$54,000. This will be operationalized as it has been in past years by verifying that proposed salaries on Worksheet V meet the new minimum requirements via certification of the Article 10A form. The legislation did not change minimum salary calculations for level three-B staff (administrators or instructional support providers).

Language in the GAA also provided additional state equalization guarantee (SEG) appropriations for two further salary increases: one for teachers and the other for all other instructional and non-instructional staff. The Legislature appropriated \$31,276,167 to provide an average 2.5% salary increase to all licensed teachers whose primary duty is classroom instruction. The language in the bill specifically indicates that this amount "does not include and is in addition to salary increases due to licensure advancement pursuant to the School Personnel Act." All teachers should advance to the new minimum salaries provided under the School Personnel Act, where applicable, prior to calculating the average 2.5% increase for minimum salaries. There is flexibility in how the average 2.5% is allocated. However, the average 2.5% salary increase must be calculated based upon total salaries after implementation of the new teacher minimum salary requirements established by Senate Bill 119 – school districts and charter schools cannot leverage the (any) increase in new minimum salaries to meet the 2.5% increase. This section of the GAA also indicated that the Secretary of Education "shall not approve the operating budget of a school district or charter school that does not provide an average two and one-half percent salary increase for all licensed teachers whose primary duty is classroom instruction."

The Legislature also appropriated \$14,143,184 to provide an average 2% salary increase for all instructional staff and other licensed and unlicensed staff who are not licensed teachers with a primary duty of classroom instruction. Language in the GAA also indicated that the Secretary of Education "shall not approve the operating budget of a school district or charter school that does not provide an average two percent salary increase for all instructional staff and other licensed and unlicensed staff who are not licensed teachers with a primary duty of classroom instruction," and "shall not approve the operating budget of a school district or charter school that does not prioritize salary increases for instructional staff or disproportionately allocates salary increases for central office administrators provided however school districts and charter schools are encouraged to allocate average salary increases the same as classroom teachers." To ensure compliance with these requirements, an additional certification form for fiscal year 2018-2019 Operating Budgets is necessary.

The school district/charter school certifies that it has met the requirements as outlined in Laws of 2018, Chapter 72, and Laws of 2018, Chapter 73.
