Course Description:

Thespian Troupe is an experiential and performance-based class, where students will work collaboratively to direct and produce shows throughout the season. Focus will be on individual reflection and growth as individual and ensemble artists.

These days will vary week to week and person to person depending on production needs. Troupe members will be provided a calendar outline at the beginning of each week. No rehearsals will be set outside of class time unless previously agreed upon by all participating members and the troupe director. Troupe members should anticipate production-based or troupe-based assignments, rehearsals/ check-ins each week, as well as actively reflect on their work in their Actor's Journal.

**Weekly schedules may vary for weeks leading up to performances. Any changes will be reflected on the white board in the classroom and on the group messaging system.

^{*}Weekly assignments and Actor's Journal entries are <u>due at the start of class at the top of each week</u> unless otherwise specified due to production needs.

Course Grades:

For this course, your grade will be determined by four elements: Weekly Communication, Assignments, Weekly Rehearsals, and Tech and Performances (backstage etiquette and performance.)

Each entry in the grade book will be out of the following point values:

•	Weekly Communication	100 pts
•	Assignments	25-50 pts
•	Weekly Rehearsals	100 pts

Communication: You will have the opportunity to earn a total of 100 points for Communication each week. Your grade will be determined by the percentage of completion of the following, on a weekly basis:

- The troupe will be using a group messaging system to communicate throughout the year. You are responsible for checking this regularly for updates and notifications.
- Troupe members are expected to respond to emails from the troupe director, troupe officers, and production teams in a timely manner.
- You are expected to communicate any scheduling conflicts in advance, to the best of your ability.

Assignments: Weekly assignments will be posted on Google Classroom. Assignments will range from 25-50 points. Students should begin working on them the day they are assigned. However, since some students may need a bit longer to complete the work to the best of their ability and in an attempt to keep students from feeling overwhelmed, ALL assignments will be officially due by the top of the class on the first day of the week. Work may be submitted before this time.

- Late Work: Late work will be accepted up to the date of the current Production <u>OR</u> the end of a grading period, whichever comes first. It is the responsibility of the student to follow up with the Troupe Director regarding late work.
- Participation looks different for everyone.
 - o IEPs and 504 Plans will be accommodated in classes.
 - o If <u>ANY</u> student feels that they are having a hard time with the material, keeping up with the assignments, or otherwise needs help in class, please be sure to advocate for yourself by speaking with me directly or by sending me an email so we can make sure you have everything you need. <u>I am here to help you.</u>

Rehearsals: Students will earn a weekly rehearsal grade. Rehearsals will be graded following rubrics that students will work together to create and have access to via Google Classroom.

Tech and Performances: Tech rehearsals and performances will be graded following rubrics that students will have access to via Google Classroom. These rubrics will be to grade the tech rehearsals and performances for all productions in the 2022-2023 season.

- O Both tech and performance grades will be based on participation, preparedness, and professionalism (these criteria will look different for each student, based on their own growth and work.)
- Tech and Performance grades will be split into two grades in the grade book: Backstage Etiquette and Performance
