All presentations should be brief and each individual speaking on an agenda item should limit his or her remarks to three (3) minutes. The Open Forum in regular Council meetings will be limited to a total of 10 minutes unless extended by a majority vote of the Council. People speaking at the Open Forum may present information to the Governing Council, but the Open Forum will include no Council actions or discussions. Individuals who wish to speak for longer than three minutes or who require Council discussion or action must use the procedure in A.15 to be placed on the Council agenda. Complaints about individual employees will not be heard at Council meetings.

If appropriate, the board may request the issue be a discussion item at a future Governing Council meeting.
