Course Description

This course is designed to provide students with a rigorous curriculum that will prepare them for the challenging coursework in high school classes. 6th grade World History includes the history of the first humans to advanced civilizations. Assignments

- **Homework** reinforces learning and is essential for success. Students may be expected to complete assignments and projects at home.
- **Graded vs. Participation:** Most assignments will be graded, but some will earn participation points.
- **Note-taking:** Students will be taught note-taking skills. Notebooks will be checked regularly.
- **Assessments:** These include tests, writing assignments, research papers, projects, performances, and group work.
