This syllabus describes general course content, requirements and materials. However, all aspects of this description are subject to my revision in order to best tailor the course to the needs of students, calendar, and circumstance.

Course Description

This program will focus on the art of music making in a band setting. Students will rehearse music together in small groups and be expected to perform the songs they have put together. Students are free to choose their own repertoire, but the songs need to be appropriate for school. Songs with foul or crude language, sexual references, drug references, or containing any form of racism, will not be tolerated and may result in the permanent removal of that student(s) from the class.

Practice

You may need to spend time outside of class working on the assigned music. And remember that greater progress is made with consistent effort over time. It is paramount that you do not wait until the last minute before a performance to solidify your repertoire.

Private Lessons

Students are highly encouraged to take private lessons. If any student is interested in seeking private lessons, I can recommend several qualified teachers.

Participation in school concerts is mandatory and counts for 30% of your final semester grade. Documentation may be required.

Not having a ride or not being able to miss work will not be excusable reasons for missing a school concert and result in a grade penalty up to failing the semester.

Google Classroom

We will utilize google classroom for the posting of daily class agendas, assignments, announcements, and other important information.

Parents/Guardians are encouraged to check their students' google classroom at least once per week. Students will be given the code to their specific section in class. These codes are not to be shared with any person outside of PAPA. Codes are class specific and should not be shared with peers outside of the specific class section.

Grading Criteria

Students will be graded on an individual basis and as a band by the instructor. Students will be asked to demonstrate their progress towards achieving the course learning objectives. This demonstration will take place during class as a performance (Test), frequent/weekly check-ins (Quiz), and Participation grades.

Classroom Etiquette

Above all students are expected to be respectful and willing to learn.

Cell Phone use is strictly prohibited as per school policy. Students may use chromebooks when they need to search source material for a song.

Bathroom breaks should be taken during passing periods.

Any student who either intentionally or through irresponsible treatment damages a school instrument or equipment will be held financially responsible for the replacement of the school instrument. If a case arises where a student has intentionally damaged or destroyed any instrument, that student will no longer have access to any school instruments and will complete alternative assignments for the remainder of the academic calendar.

Cell Phones

Cell Phones will no longer be used in class for any reason as per school policy.

Students who do not wish to follow these guidelines of conduct and etiquette will be placed on a behavior contract and may be excluded from participation in guitar related events inside and outside of the classroom.
